Tradition trashed?

FREMANTLE council has binned its traditional citizenship ceremony on Australia Day.

Council will instead hold the ceremony and its citizen of the year awards on January 23.

The move cuts any remaining major ties between Freo council and Australia Day – it previously ditched its January 26 fireworks in 2017.

The date change was made by the city's administration and did not come before elected councillors for the vote as it was an "operational" matter.

Fremantle mayor Hannah Fitzhardinge says the new date was more inclusive and better reflected community sentiment.

"We've heard on numerous occasions over the past few years that there is a level of discomfort with receiving citizenship or an award on a date that is the subject of considerable public debate," she says.

"Holding it on another date removes this issue and allows us to focus on celebrating those who are becoming citizens or receiving recognition for their contribution to our community. We are proud of the fact that Fremantle council has been leading the conversation on reconciliation for many years now..."

"We know there is strong support for reconciliation in the local community, and this was again evidenced by the strong 'yes' vote from voters within the City of Fremantle in last year's referendum."

In 2022 the Albanese government changed the rules to allow councils to cancel their citizenship ceremonies on Australia Day, sparking claims they were waging a covert war against Australia Day and getting councils to do their "dirty work" for them.

Earlier this month a report revealed that 81 councils had taken up the offer, with at least a dozen in Perth including Mosman Park, Cambridge, Victoria Park, Rockingham and Wanneroo. But it's business as usual

But it's business as usual in Melville and Cockburn, where councils are holding citizenship ceremonies and events on Australia Day.

Cockburn are spending \$129,500 on its Australia Day Coogee Beach Festival, which includes a \$20,000 grant from the Australia Day Council WA.

"I acknowledge that people have mixed feelings about Australia Day," says Cockburn mayor Logan Howlett.

"The National Australia Day Council has stated that our national day can be a time where we celebrate and mourn at the same time, when we can honour all that is great about Australia and being Australian, while also remembering the suffering and our shortcomings; and commit to build a more cohesive and inclusive nation."

Melville council will spend \$8,900 on its traditional Australia Day BBQ Breakfast, where they hold a citizenship ceremony and announce the community citizen of the year.

year. "The BBQ Breakfast has been running for 23 years and the feedback that the city has received about the event is that it's a positive, friendly and respectful environment with about 600 to 800 people attending each year," says Melville mayor Katy Mair.

"Although no community members have personally approached me about changing the date of the citizenship ceremony or this event, I understand there are some people who do not want to attend a celebration on this date and we'll continue to listen to the community's feedback on the topic and respond accordingly.

Dowding's back

FORMER WA premier Peter Dowding, 80, has gone into bat for Fremantle's youngest ever councillor Jemima Williamson-Wong in a legal election spat.

The ex-lawyer recently appeared on Ms Williamson-Wong's behalf at Fremantle Magistrate's Court, where the outcome of last year's Fremantle local government election was being contested.

Ms Williamson-Wong won the Coastal Ward. defeating Marija Vujcic by 71 votes after preferences, but in the lead-up to the election the WA Electoral Commission initially sent out the wrong ballot papers to voters in the new Central and Coastal Wards.

Election spat

A South Fremantle resident, Mr Dowding says he is working pro bono for Ms Williamson-Wong and came to her aid during the festive period when she was struggling to find legal representation.

The initial hearing at Fremantle Magistrate's Court was largely procedural, where attendees were told they had to write an affidavit to show they were "interested parties"

Mr Dowding said he found it bizarre the hearing was held behind closed-doors as it concerned a public election. He told the Herald the

matter was likely to be heard in the Perth Magistrates Court as Fremantle didn't have the facilities to accomodate it. He said because of the

relatively high voter turnout at last year's Fremantle council election, he thought it unlikely the result would be overturned. Mr Dowding says he's getting on a bit for a full legal battle, so Ms Williamson-Wong will likely find another lawyer moving forward.

It's been a baptism of fire for the 21-year-old university student, since being elected in October last year. In December an

anonymous flyer was delivered to letterboxes in South Fremantle asking "How can an inexperienced 21-yearold uni student possibly represent our electorate?" ('Fury greets flyer attack' December 9, Fremantle Herald).

The Chook contacted Ms Williamson-Wong, but she didn't get back to us.


Community participation often starts at schools and sport clubs, for those who have children, and often grows from there. People nominate for committees, or ultimately step up and stand for council.

Fremantle people volunteer as tourist guides at the Roundhouse, Shipwrecks Museum, Maritime Museum, Visitor Centre and Fremantle Port, or become lifesavers at Leighton Beach, organise the North Freo Bowlo and community garden, the Sea Rescue, Politics in the Pub, Valley Verges, Save Leighton, or are working at the Men's Shed, etc.

It is quite remarkable how many of us take ownership of our community and regularly sacrifice some of their private time to help improve our cities, for no personal gain. As a former long-time Roundhouse volunteer I know that it can feel like a bit of a slog to stand on your feet for five hours, talking to a lot of people from all over the world, sometimes in the cold and rain, or in the heat. 

TNTs matter

y business partner Matthew recently travelled to Ireland with his family to visit loved ones over Christmas. While he was there, he and his wife managed to scoot across the channel for a few days by themselves at a high-class hotel in Scotland.

The accommodation was lovely and although they had a nice time and enjoyed the sojourn, Matt relayed to me that the hotel missed the mark with some minor items. For a start the staff often left the vacuum cleaner in the hallway outside of their hotel room. It's no biggie of course to side-step a Hoover, unless it puts you in immediate danger of stepping on a room service tray that's having an augmented relationship with the hallway carpet. Dinner in the hotel's fancy restaurant was divine – a delectable table d'hote of fine fair accompanied by an exceptional vintage vino. But the ambience ebbed just slightly when a set of drawers at the waiters' station stayed open all night reminiscent of an IKEA display unit.

wounded. Some clients will observe these little things and others won't, but TNTs can be the difference between bad, good or great service.

Customer service is arguably the most critical component of the success or otherwise of a business. An upset customer coming off a bad experience has the tools (like social media) to seriously damage a business.

It's easy to miss these TNTs as a business owner because they are tiny. Customers rarely complain about TNTs, because they feel like they're nit-picking. But they can impact on their overall experience and the likelihood of them returning or referring. The best way to hunt down your bad TNTs is to conduct a customer facing audit. Have a friend or colleague that is unknown to your staff go through the customer experience from start to finish with a critical eye and use the findings to make changes and train your team.

Rent Bidding


E arly this year, the West Australian parliament are likely to pass into law changes to the Residential Tenancies Act designed to further protect the interest of tenants.

Some of the changes bring WA into line with other states where substantial tenant-friendly changes have altered tenant-landlord relationships and, in some cases, have deterred investment and pushed up rents. Many of the changes will be relatively benign, such as rent increases limited to no more than every twelve months (currently it is a minimum of six months).

None of the laws encourage investors to further supply rental stock by improving protections for landlords from tenants that breach the lease agreement and / or wilfully damage the property.

One of the changes will be to make it illegal for a landlord (or their property manager) to encourage a tenant to offer more rent to secure a lease. Known as 'rent bidding', in a tight rental market it is common for tenants to offer more than the advertised rent for a property. A ban will not prevent a tenant from offering more rent than





Already, property managers are advertising asking rents with a "From" in front. This makes it more difficult for tenants to determine fair market rent, especially once rental bidding is formally banned. Mostly, landlords are seeking quality tenants at a reasonable rent. Many will choose the best tenant over one offering the highest rent. Property managers have a duty to their landlord to secure the best possible lease outcome for their client and the rent achieved is but one component. Banning rent bidding will do nothing to further the plight of tenants already dealing with a highly competitive, stressful market of limited supply and rising rents. Governments should spend their time thinking about how they can get more rental supply into the market by actively encouraging property investors. Everything else treats the symptom not the cause and rents will continue to rise.

At FAJ we call these TNTs or tiny noticeable things. They have the ability to leave a client feeling either wowed or TNTs can also be positive. A team member once related to me a story of a local restaurant where all staff members say hello and goodbye to every patron, even from the kitchen. Simple but effective. It doesn't make the food taste better, but diners leave feeling happy. Good TNTs can be as effortless as using the customer's first name or offering to carry goods to the customer's car.

If you think through the customer experience in detail, with an open mind and preferably with the rest of your team, you'll be able to discover your own TNTs and set yourself apart from your competitors.

tenants will be 'flying blind'.

In other states, rent bidding is already banned, but the outcome of the ban has failed to afford any additional benefit for tenants. In the current market, most properties receive multiple applications to rent with many tenants prepared to offer more than the asking rent to secure the property. Under the current arrangement, tenants will typically seek guidance from the leasing agent as to what constitutes market rental value and without specifying the details of competing applications, tenants are able to secure a lease by offering a modest amount above the asking rent.

Rockin' trail

BON SCOTT'S home, the Dingo Flour Mill and Indigenous history are set to feature in a modern revamp of the North Fremantle Heritage Trail.

Originally named the Rocky Bay Heritage Trail, it was established in 1988 as an Australian Bicentenary project and included a brochure celebrating the area's local history.

It was renamed the North Fremantle Heritage Trail in 2004, but since then no big upgrades have been made and the signage is looking tired. Fremantle mayor Hannah

Fitzhardinge says it will get a

digital revamp with interactive QR codes and new displays.

"This is a good opportunity for Fremantle residents and visitors alike to explore this unique neighbourhood and learn about the peninsula's fascinating past," says Freo mayor Hannah Fitzhardinge.

We are forming a Project Reference Group and we are also encouraging people with untold stories and insights to share them with us, so that these 'hidden gems' can be used to enhance the trail. "As well as acknowledging the

Indigenous and colonial history, we want to celebrate some of North Fremantle's more recent cultural heritage such as the iconic Dingo Flour Mill and Bon Scott's home.'

Fremantle council will meet with Whadjuk Elders to get a deeper understanding of the area, with a view to integrate their stories and culture.

Landmarks include culturally significant Whadjuk Nyoongar sites along the Swan River foreshore, the former Soap Factory and limestone quarries, notable homes and their

famous (or infamous) residents, iconic streets, Cypress Hill, old post offices, the Hillcrest Hospital and the Town Hall.

Fremantle Society president John Dowson says he hopes the trail will have a mix of historical information.

'There is a need to have adequate funds for high quality interpretive signage, and seating, to encourage people to get out there,' Mr Dowson says.

Quite a bit of the work has already been done from previous heritage trails. It is important to have balanced interpretation histories told, not like Cantonment Hill, where all the excellent signage is about only Aboriginal history.

"Fremantle council has a massive backlog throughout parks and suburbs to repair signage. It also seems to have forgotten about the long discussed Maritime Heritage Trail. What happened?"

To gather information on the North Fremantle Heritage Trail. Freo council will hold a self-guided walk, scavenger hunt, guided twilight walk and an online map and survey.



Residents will have access to shared spaces, their own private secure entrance, and easy access to support services in the Community Centre next door.

Mr Piu says they plan to appoint a builder by mid-2024, and finish construction by the end of 2025.

For more than 50 years, St Pat's has provided emergency accomodation and shelter to the homeless and disadvantaged in Greater Fremantle.

Housing and homelessness minister John Carey says the funding was part of a push to increase the social housing stock across Western Australia. "As part of our Call for

Submissions for Community Housing Providers, the Cook Government is funding \$7.5 million to St Pat's Fremantle to provide more social housing for vulnerable Western Australians," he said.

"The Cook Government is deeply proud to support St Pat's Fremantle, who are one of the longest-serving community service providers, playing an integral role in assisting people who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

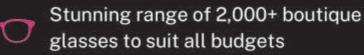



Epic scam

A *CHOOK* reader targeted by international scammers wants to warn others of a diabolical scheme preying on Perth men looking for a date.

The scheme extorts victims out of thousands of dollars by threatening to send intimate videos of them to their family and friends.

The blackmailers connect with their targets on online dating platforms and then set up a video call in hopes of gathering racy footage to use as extortion material. The scams have become increasingly common over the past few years, but what surprised our reader was the length of time the scammer committed to the ruse.

After matching on the dating app Tinder, this scammer spent weeks texting with the target before asking for a video chat.

For "at least two weeks, if not more," our reader Mark (not his real name) told us, which made him think it was unlikely a scammer would spend that much time on a target.

The scammer was in the Philippines but Tinder allows people to search for dates in distant places. She came up with a cover story that she worked at a Perth hotel and was in the Philippines for a holiday until February.

Then this week she asked for a video chat via Instagram, and things quickly heated up.

Such steamy video calls are pretty common among young daters: About 50 per cent of generation Y and generation Z have sent a nude image of themselves or disrobed during a video chat, according to a 2023 study published in Archives of Sexual Behaviour.

"It's pretty normal," our gen-Z source said, "for me and my

generation, this is pretty common," and this had followed a pretty typical flirty trajectory.

Shortly after the call started the woman exposed her breasts, and asked the target to show himself.

The heat of the moment lowered our source's guard enough to heed her request.

"I see breasts, my normal reaction is: F*** yeah," Mark says. "So I obviously go to whip out my appendage and, you know, give it a few one-two-threes."

And then the woman asked him to show his face again. Shortly after he did, she hung up.

"A few minutes go past, and she sends me a screen recording of literally what I was just doing."

"And then she sends me a screenshot of all my contacts," including parents, friends and family, whose accounts were found on social media.

"And then she's like: Send me \$10,000, or I send it.

"This all happens at like 10pm and I'm freaking out. And the other thing is I didn't want to tell anyone obviously, because like I'm ashamed that I was in this position in the first place, like a f***ing idiot."

They bargained down to \$1,000. Mark first attempted to send the payment via PayPal, but the platform refused to let the payment go through. The transfer eventually worked via the international transfer service Remitly, sending the money to a bank account in the Philippines.

But it wasn't enough: almost immediately, the scammer asked for more money, now wanting \$4,000 to delete the video.

Mark says that's when he realised they could just keep

asking for more, and he got angry.

While stalling the blackmailer with a few invectives, he set all his social media accounts to private, and then blocked the scam accounts.

He reported the encounter to Remitly and to the police via the federal ReportCyber website, providing the scammer's phone number, name and the bank account details.

The police contacted Mark the next day, and he says "they figured out who they were". The initial PayPal transfer failing made the scammers desperate enough to send their bank account number. Police are also able to create a "hash", a unique code related to the video, that can be put in databases to prevent the video being uploaded to popular porn or social media sites.

Because Mark reported the crime quickly to Remitly, the company was able to cancel the payment before it was finalised and the \$1000 was returned to his account.

Mark says the police "were actually really good. They're just like: Yeah, you're not alone, there's heaps of people this happens to, but it's really good that you're coming forward and telling us about it.


"So many people are ashamed, which I totally get."

But Mark was more angry than ashamed, and he says "I'm pretty happy that I spoke out, because obviously you could tell that they'd done it to a lot of people," given how practiced the scammers seemed.

"So who knows how much money they've taken from other people?"

Titanic tale

by GORDON LEE

Y grandfather Herbert William Lee (1875-1921) was a professional soldier.

A company sergeant major drill instructor, he served in the Boer War and the Great War in the 1/28th Battalion as a member of the WA Mounted Rifles.

Herbert was an Englishman and married a Welsh girl Mabel Frances Finch-Davis.

They migrated in September 1902 to Western Australia and lived in the Fremantle Drill Hall.

He was discharged medically unfit and it seems his injuries were sustained from falling off a bike (probably drunk going on my father's memories of him) while on duty in England during World War I.

Herbert and his wife are buried in Fremantle Cemetery.

His brother Reginald Robinson Lee (1870-1913) was notable for the fact he was lookout on the Titanic, in the crow's nest at the time of collision with the iceberg.

Reg spent his early working life in the Royal Navy.

He was discharged in 1900 because he was "unreliable where alcohol is obtainable".

In 1912 he was lookout on the Titanic – perhaps there was a lack of due diligence on crew appointments on the great ship.

He survived the Titanic but he could not survive his demons

The two brothers only lived to their mid-40s.

Both had a weakness for alcohol.



A friend visited the Kew records office to look for the service record of RR Lee and could not understand how a naval officer could have thrown away a career in the navy for a life as an able seaman in the merchant navy.

He made these notes... He left the RN under a cloud – he was placed on the retired list on 1st Feb 1900 – because he had a severe drink problem.

The captain of his last ship wrote on July 1899: 'Performance of duty not at all satisfactory, cannot be depended on to do his work punctually and carefully without constant supervision. On the whole a very unreliable officer. He cannot be trusted when liquor is obtainable. He has intemperate habits.'

He had previously been sent home from Jamaica on the SS Spartan in 1898 after a spell in hospital suffering from Delirium Tremenal caused by his drink problem.


Bearing in mind that as a paymaster he was responsible for all the ship's stores, he would have had unlimited access to the ship's rum supply.

Would he have been cold stone sober when he was a lookout on the Titanic some 12 years later?

My experience of 23 years in the Royal Navy tells that those with an alcohol problem do not shake it off

easily. It probably also ruined his marriage.

So resplendent in his naval officer's uniform, achieving 85 per cent in his paymaster's exam and throwing it all away. What a shame!



It won't make you feel like you're in a void, it makes you the void, sucking life and energy from those around you for it to disappear.


You go on as you did feeling the water slosh and swirl inside of you.
